Lynn White's ED Classroom at Fairfield Union High School has had some very exciting Work Study trips thus far this school year. Their first trip to downtown Lancaster was a great success! Prior to the trip, students learned about

their transportation options within the county. Each student was able to fill out an application for the mobility program with Lancaster Transit, which was used for transportation on their field trip. Students visited the Fairfield County Library and various area businesses to discuss resources and programming available to them. They had lunch at Bob's BBQ and then set out for the Decorative Arts Center. While at the DAC, students were able to tour an exhibit from an artist who survived the Holocaust.



On Mrs. White's next classroom excursion, they completed an adventure to Alley Park where students were able to participate in a variety of new experiences. The theme for the trip was to have courage and try something new!



Character development is a crucial piece of the puzzle for making sure students are ready for the "real world" post-graduation and Mrs. White and her team were able to cultivate true adventurers throughout the day.

The team had students create their own grill and cook their own vegan/vegetarian lunch.
Students learned what they liked in

vegan cooking, vegan grilled cheese... and what they did not like so much, vegan sunflower seed bread (yuck!).



The students also had a trail walk where their task was to collect items for an art project to be created at the end. Students had 11 minutes to create their masterpiece. Students were able to create individual and group art pieces



requiring them to communicate effectively, operate under time constraints, and commit to the project their team decided upon. Three students were even able to create a walking bridge to a small island within their allotted 11 minute time frame.


